#### **Module Aims**

This module aims to develop your understanding, knowledge and perception of intellectual and/or developmental disabilities (e.g., Down's Syndrome, Autism and ADHD); exploring basic facts about causes of disabilities, historical and contemporary concepts and models of disability, implications of terminologies such as intellectual disabilities, learning disabilities and learning difficulties, and ways to support individuals through exploration of case scenarios.
