Module Aims

This academic skills module introduces participants to the principles and philosophical foundations of social research, including both quantitative and qualitative approaches. It equips learners with essential skills to design and evaluate small-scale research projects, critically assess published research, and apply ethical standards. Through interactive sessions, participants will learn how to formulate research questions, select appropriate methodologies, methods, and interpret research findings. The module also supports participants at different stages of research, whether developing a new project or seeking guidance on an ongoing one, offering practical tools and mentorship to strengthen research in the fields of disability, mental health, and inclusion.
